



1. Required permits may vary between local jurisdictions. Per CalRecycle, biomass conversion is defined in Division 30 of the Public Resources Code 40106 and if the activity meets this definition it does not require a Solid Water Facility Permit (SWFP) since it has been separated from the solid wate stream. If there is also an element to the project where there may be chipping and grinding activities, then may be subject to the required to the requirements in Title 14, California Code of Regulatory, Requisions, Chapter 3.1. Compostable Materials Handling Operations and Facilities Regulatory Requirements.



* Permit to Operate for Local Air District obtained 6-12 months after operations start. Able to start operations with ATC.
