Senate Bill 1383

- Reduce organic waste disposal:
 - 50% by 2020
 - 75% by 2025
- Recover 20% of edible food currently disposed by 2025.
- •Regulations approved in November 2020.
- •Regulations took effect January 2022.

SB 1383 Implementation









CR&R Anaerobic Digestion Facility
Perris, CA

- Local jurisdictions must
 - Adopt enforcement ordinances.
 - Establish food recovery programs.
 - Develop organic waste collection systems.
 - Build organic waste processing infrastructure.
 - Procure recovered organic waste products.





Little Hoover Commission

- Independent state oversight agency.
- Investigates state government operations and policy.
- Board made up of 13 members.









- 1. Pause on SB 1383 implementation.
- 2. Fund an educational campaign.
- 3. CalEPA, CalRecycle, and CARB should coordinate to facilitate development of necessary infrastructure.





- 4. Expand market opportunities.
- 5. Allow flexibility in procurement.
- 6. Support near-zero emission vehicles until commercially viable zero-emission vehicles are available.



- 7. Exempt counties that produce less than 200,000 tons per year of waste.
- 8. Encourage and provide incentives for community composting.
- 9. Learn from industry and from other countries, and field-test regulations.



- 10. Remove edible food recovery.
- 11. Monitor and mitigate methane super-emitter facilities.
- 12. Conduct a cost-benefit analysis, provide resources to implement changes, and not rely on competitive grants.

Public Comments

- CalRecycle & multiple waste industry stakeholders are against temporarily pausing SB 1383.
- Estimated \$500 million spent on SB 1383 efforts so far.
- Many local jurisdictions are already implementing SB 1383.
- Representatives from rural areas support the pause because they need some form of relief.









Next Steps

- The Little Hoover Commission voted to move forward with the draft report with technical changes.
