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I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:07 p.m.

II. UPDATE ON FACILITATION CONTRACT AND DRAFT FINAL REPORT

Sue Higgins provided an update regarding the facilitation contract and the final draft report. ARI has received various comments regarding the report, and would like additional feedback on the key issues which the Subcommittee believes have not been addressed. At present, a consensus has been reached to move forward with the competition process and to provide a menu of potential incentives within the report. Mr. Alva noted that the purpose of the incentives was to allow maximum flexibility and opportunities for decision makers. Mr. Mohajer stressed that the ultimate role of the Subcommittee is to help the project move forward and to facilitate the development of a demonstration project, which will ultimately be decided by the Board of Supervisors.

Discussion ensued related to the Report on a section by section basis. Several comments focused Section 5.7, which summarizes technical findings of the various technologies. Based on comments received, ARI will incorporate some additional summary tables into the report, and develop a new draft tracking changes based on comments submitted. Staff will provide Subcommittee members with a redlined-strikeout version and clean version next week. ARI also reported that they have reinitiated efforts to identify a university contact to conduct a peer review of the report. The work on this subject is ongoing, and is currently at the information receiving stage. ARI will report on this subject at an upcoming meeting.

III. OPEN DISCUSSION

Mr. Skye commented that the Subcommittee has received various requests for letters of support for proposed conversion technology projects in California. Mr. Skye added that any letter drafted on behalf of the Subcommittee will be provided to members for review and feedback, and once a consensus is reached, be signed by Mr. Alva.
